

BS 406C - Romans

SYLLABUS

3 Hour Course

Description

This course is a complete study of the book of Romans chapter by chapter. Special emphasis will be placed on understanding the argument of Romans, doing research on a selected topic from the book, and a project that seeks to apply the book in a practical way. (Revised Fall 2011)

Objectives

By taking this course the student will:

1. Understand the structure of Paul's letter to the Roman church.
2. Recognize Paul's argument throughout Romans.
3. Apply the teachings found in Romans.
4. Develop his or her methods of research and written presentation.
