Crime Prevention Tips

- Exterior doors to resident halls should **NEVER** be propped open
- Anytime you leave your room **LOCK** the door
- Residents should **NEVER** give access to resident halls or university buildings to unknown or suspicious individuals
- **STAY ALERT!** Grace University is located in an urban environment please pay attention for suspicious, dangerous, or damaging activities and report them to security immediately
- Park in well lit areas
- Always lock your car doors even when you will be gone for only a few minutes
- Don't walk alone; especially at night
- Utilize campus transportation service from any phone with no charge
- ***Please do not ever hesitate to call security***

These and numerous other safety procedures and counsel are printed in University literature (Grace University Catalog and the Student Handbook). Campus safety is emphasized in the Fall and Spring orientation sessions for new students.

General Information

Grace University Campus Security **does not function as police**. Campus security provides an on campus presence designated to observe and report potential security issues. Security works closely with campus facility services, SDO, the Omaha Police department, and all emergency services. Security personnel are on campus 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Campus crime is a reality and preventing and reporting it is a responsibility of all Grace community members. If you see or suspect criminal activity, you cannot assume that someone else has reported it. Whether you are a victim or an observer, you need to report all crimes, suspicious activities, and safety concerns to Grace University Security.

For all emergencies dial 911. You do not need proof a crime occurred, to contact the police.

Students, faculty, and staff must report all crimes and medical or fire emergencies to campus security. A follow up investigation may be necessary, which will be conducted by the police.

All crimes must be reported to the police.

Reporting an incident to campus security and the Omaha Police helps:

- Identify and capture the alleged criminal
- Maintain future options regarding criminal prosecution or campus discipline
- Protect the victim and others from future crimes by the same assailant

When calling Grace University Security

Please provide the following information:

- Name
- Location of incident
- Time of incident (if known)
- Nature of the incident
- Description of person involved (if known)
- Description of vehicles involved

The Omaha police will request similar information.

Response to all security calls

All crimes reported and calls to security are considered serious and are responded to appropriately in a timely manner. Each security officer has been trained and will use all reasonable resources to ensure the safety of the Grace community. A log of reported crimes is maintained in the security office and is available to the Grace community.

Also, yearly campus crime statistics are distributed. Furthermore, all community members will be notified immediately about any pattern of crimes or incidents that threaten campus safety. An announcement will also appear on the Grace University website.
