

Grace University Multicultural Scholarship

The Grace University Multicultural Scholarship is available to underrepresented ethnic students* who are US citizens committed to enrolling full-time and completing an academic program offered solely at Grace University (cooperative programs do not apply). The awarded amount will be up to \$11,000 per year (renewable for up to four years) for students living in University residence halls and up to \$9,000 per year for off-campus students. The awarded student must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA while enrolled at Grace and may be ineligible for other Grace University awards including any that were previously awarded.

To receive this award, students must meet all the qualifications for admission to the University.

Those qualifications include:

- 2.5 high school (or college) GPA
- 20 Composite ACT score
- Personal relationship with Jesus Christ

Applicants must complete the Grace University application process by:

- Submitting the Application for Admission and all related documents.
- Submitting the FASFA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to Grace University.

Recipients of this award will be notified by the Grace University Financial Aid Office once all required documentation is received. Students ***who do not meet the qualifications for admission*** may be considered for the award after an on-campus interview process is completed.

*underrepresented ethnic students include those who are not part of the majority ethnic population of currently enrolled students (White/Caucasian). One or both of the student's parents must be full-blooded within their ethnicity. In some instances qualification will be determined on a case by case basis.
